The NIMH funded **SAGE-SR** is a HIPPA compliant, clinically validated, behavioral health screen and assessment compatible with the ICD-11 and the DSM-5.

30 DSM-5 conditions are evaluated in a single 15-minute self-report session from any PC, tablet or smart phone. Results are 100%.

How The SAGE-SR Works

SAGE-SR Screening & Assessment Modules

- To insure privacy and confidentiality, no login or email is required to take the **SAGE-SR**.
- The **SAGE-SR** screening module asks a series of initial questions to identify potential disorders in four DSM-5 categories listed below.
- When the results of the screen meet the threshold in any category, the **SAGE-SR** assessment module is initiated with a more in-depth set of evaluation questions.

SAGE-SR Report

- The **SAGE-SR** report is immediately available in downloadable PDF format upon completion of assessment.
- Report indicates potential primary and co-occurring DSM-5 conditions.
- Conditions that are not present or have minimal symptoms are also identified.

❗ Generalized Anxiety Disorder

❗ Panic Disorder

2 Panic attacks in past 7 days	Peak within minutes

❗ Social Anxiety Disorder
